

PRIVACY POLICY

This Privacy Policy was last updated and is effective as of March 28, 2019.

Thank you for visiting our website and for showing interest in our company. We are Kemper Water Control Systems, Inc. ("Kemper," "we," "us," or "our"). Your privacy is important to us, which is why we have developed this Privacy Policy to explain our practices regarding the use and disclosure of personally identifiable information we obtain online from users of this website located at www.kemperwatercontrol.com (the "Website") who reside in the United States. If you are a resident outside of the United States, please see the applicable privacy policy elsewhere on this Website or on the website of our parent company, Gebr. Kemper GmbH + Co. KG.

Collecting General Data and Information on the Website

We generally collect the following information each time a user visits the Website: (1) the user's browser type and version used, (2) the operating system used, (3) the website from which the user accesses the Website (so-called referrer site), (4) the sub-pages on the Website visited by the user, (5) the date and time of access to the Website, (6) the Internet Protocol (IP) address of the device used by the user to access the Website, (7) the Internet service provider (ISP) used, and (8) other similar data and information. We reserve the right to transfer or disclose user information collected through the Website, including user personal information, for other business reasons of ours (including in connection with an assignment of our rights covered under the paragraph below captioned "Assignment").

We also reserve the right to change the manner of our use and disclosure in accordance with the "Changes in Our Privacy Policy" section below.

Use of Cookies

Legal Bases for Processing Personal Information of European Union Residents or Other GDPR Data Subjects

If you are a GDPR Data Subject, Kemper may rely on one or more of the following legal bases (or other available legal grounds) when processing your personal information, depending on the circumstances:

- (a) Legitimate Interests Kemper may process your personal information where Kemper has a legitimate interest in such processing for managing, operating or promoting our business, and that legitimate interest is not overridden by your interests, fundamental rights or freedoms.
- (b) Consent Kemper may process your personal information where Kemper has obtained your consent to the processing.
- (c) Contractual Necessity Kemper may process your personal information where such processing is necessary in connection with any contract that Kemper has with you.
- (d) Legal Requirements Kemper may process your personal information where such processing is required by applicable law.

Disclosures to Third Parties

If you are a GDPR Data Subject, your personal information will not be disclosed to third parties except where it is necessary for fulfillment of Kemper's obligations to you or where Kemper is obliged or permitted to do so by law (including, without limitation, through the terms of any agreement Kemper may have with you), or where Kemper makes disclosures that are otherwise consistent with the uses described in this Policy.

Kemper may also disclose any information (including personal information) relating to you to law enforcement authorities or any regulatory or government authority in response to any request including requests in connection with the investigation of any suspected illegal activities.

Kemper reserves the right to transfer any personal information Kemper has about you in the event Kemper sells or transfers all or a portion of our business or assets, or merges with another organization. Should such a sale, transfer or merger occur, Kemper will use reasonable efforts seeking to require that the transferee uses personal information you have provided to Kemper in a manner that is consistent with this Policy.

Kemper will not sell, resell or lease your personal information to any third parties but Kemper may, if required for the purpose(s) for which your personal information was collected and processed, share it with Kemper partners and/or service providers to enable them to provide their services to Kemper or to you, as applicable. The foregoing are in addition to the other uses described elsewhere in this Policy.

Security of Personal Information of European Residents or Other GDPR Data Subjects

Kemper has policies and technical and organizational measures in place which are intended to safeguard and protect your personal information against unauthorized access, accidental loss, improper use and disclosure. However, you should be aware that information transmitted over the internet is not completely secure because of the nature of the internet and that systems and measures used to secure information are not flawless. For these reasons, although Kemper will use reasonable efforts to protect your personal information, Kemper does not warrant the security of personal information transmitted to Kemper or stored by Kemper, and personal information that is transmitted to Kemper by you electronically is done at your own risk.

Retention of Personal Information of European Residents or Other GDPR Data Subjects

Kemper's policy is to retain your personal information only for as long as is necessary to fulfill the purposes for which Kemper collected such personal information, including for the purposes of satisfying any professional, legal, accounting or reporting requirements to which Kemper is subject. To determine the appropriate retention period for personal information, Kemper considers the scope, nature and sensitivity of the personal information, the potential risk of harm from unauthorized use or disclosure of the personal information, the purposes for which Kemper collected and processed your personal information and whether Kemper can achieve those purposes through other means, and any applicable legal and professional requirements.

Your Rights as a European Resident or Other GDPR Data Subject

If you are a GDPR Data Subject, you have a number of rights concerning your personal information that Kemper holds and uses, including the following:

- (a) Right of Access You have the right to be informed about what personal information Kemper holds about you and to a copy of this personal information.
- (b) Right to Rectification You have the right to have any inaccurate personal information which Kemper holds about you updated or corrected.
- (c) Right to Erasure In certain circumstances you may request that Kemper delete the personal information that Kemper holds about you.
- (d) Right to Complain You have the right to lodge a complaint regarding the processing of your personal information to an applicable governmental or supervisory authority in your country.
- (e) Right to Withdraw Consent Where processing of personal information is based on your consent, you have the right to withdraw such consent at any time.
- (f) Right to Object Where Kemper relies on our legitimate interests to process your personal information, you have the right to object to such use and Kemper is required to discontinue such processing unless Kemper can demonstrate an overriding legitimate interest in such processing.
- (g) Right to Restriction You have the right to request that Kemper stop using your personal information in certain circumstances including if you believe that the personal information Kemper holds about you is inaccurate or that Kemper's use of your personal information is unlawful. If you validly exercise this right, Kemper will store your personal information and will not carry out any other processing until the issue is resolved.
